Come Prepared

Check-In

On arrival check-in at the volunteer area (see map). Scheduled shift start time is the time you need to check-in.

Briefing

Your coordinator will brief you after check-in. This is an opportunity to ask real questions and review your duties. Read all the information given to you by your coordinator so you know what is expected of you.

Redeployment

Volunteers may be called upon to assist in other areas should a shortage arise. Redeployment offers job variety and the opportunity to meet more fellow volunteers.

Absenteeism

Contact the Volunteer Coordinator at 306-774-6478 as soon as possible if you cannot attend work. If possible please find a replacement prior to calling.

Come Prepared

Uniforms

Wear your bandana and any special safety equipment provided at all times during your shift.

Personal Items

There are no secure areas to store personal belongings. Please do not bring valuable items to work.

Lost & Found Property

If you lose or find anything, please check with the Welcome Booth. We cannot accept responsibility for possessions brought to the festival.

Smoking

Please do not smoke when on duty and, when on a break, use discretion and move away from the children's activities areas. Smoking is not allowed in any tents.



Come Prepared

Drinking Water

You will be given a water-bottle, refill it as you need. Free water is available at drinking stations throughout the site and in the volunteer check-in/break area.

Meals & Break

Ensure you have eaten before your shift. Most shifts are 4.5 hours long. If you are working 8 or more hours, a meal voucher and lunch break will be provided. Your coordinator will schedule your breaks.

Parking

Parking is available at the corner of Marston St. and 11th Ave. S.W. A shuttle service is available from the parking lot.

Clothing

This is an outdoor festival with jobs inside tents and outside. Dress appropriately for the weather. Make sure you have comfortable footwear for walking in stubble fields riddled with gopher holes. Pack a hat, sunscreen, and bug spray.

Customer Service

You are our festival ambassadors.
We know we can count on you to:

- Be enthusiastic and smile!
- Welcome guests and invite them to visit all of the festival.
- Encourage kids in the activities that they choose.
- Proactively provide assistance and direction.

Shift Times

Morning Shift: 9am - 1:30pm

Afternoon Shift: 1pm - 5:30pm

The half hour overlap between shifts allow time for the change-over of volunteers

Evacuation

If the site needs to be evacuated, instructions and direction will come from PA announcements. You may be asked to assemble at the muster point. Always stay calm. Coordinators will be responsible for contacting their individual crew, safeguarding equipment, and exiting area.

Hazardous Situations

Report unusual or potentially dangerous situations such as wasp nests, broken glass, faulty electrical lines, etc. to your coordinator.

Lost Children

Always stay with lost children/parents and radio the volunteer coordinator.



The Environment

Please do your part to maintain a clean festival site by disposing of personal trash properly and using recycling containers as appropriate. Recycling stations are available for cardboard, plastic, and beverage containers.

Values

The Windscape Kite Festival is presented with the values of providing a safe, inclusive, quality cultural event in a family centered atmosphere.



Safety Information

In the event of an emergency:

- Look after your safety first
- Call 911 then your coordinator
- If it is safe to do so protect equipment in your area
- Follow instructions from your coordinator and the Emergency Action Plan (EAP) that is with each coordinator, at the Volunteer Check-in, and at the Welcome Booth

First Aid

Make sure you know where to get help! If the situation is serious, always CALL 911.

The First Aid station is located south of the food trucks and there are smaller first aid kits at both token sellers and in the volunteer lounge.



Incident/Injury Reports

Volunteers are asked to complete an incident report whenever there is:

- A lost child
- A near miss situation or an incident in which injury almost occurred but did not
- A major incident requiring on site first aid and stabilization until emergency medical assistance arrives on the scene
- A vehicle accident (whether you are involved as a driver or as a witness)
- Damaged, lost, or stolen equipment

Be sure to write down as much information as possible regarding the circumstances of the incident. Incident Report forms are available at the Volunteer Check-In, Welcome Booth, or from the coordinator. Completed forms can be passed on to us at the same locations.
